The private sector can contribute to SDGs via a transition from conventional to sustainable investments. Sustainability criteria enter decision-making processes when they contribute to reduce negative environmental and social impact of investments, as well as reduce environmental, social and governance risks.

Incentives are important (interest rates depending on environmental performance) to adopt financial instruments for greener investments.

The sanitation market has a huge potential of growth to meet universal service provision goals, and companies have sufficient funding capacity.

There is a rapid growth of funds and green finance instruments: plenty of resources are available for climate change but there is not enough adaptation, and not enough incentives to attract international funds.
